

# **OTOW Central**

- Leasehold (99 year land lease).
- Maintenance-free, not free maintenance.
- Own from paint inward.
- Structure insured under master policy but owner must provide "renter's insurance" for contents.
- Can use all OTOW Central amenities.
- Cannot use Candler, Indigo and Weybourne Landing amenities.

# Indigo

- Fee simple.
- Responsible for home insurance & maintenance.
- Can use Indigo amenities
- Can use OTOW Central amenities with purchase of "Gateway of Services" pass for \$900/home/year.
- Cannot use Candler or Weybourne Landing amenities.

# Candler Hills

- Fee simple (own land)
- Responsible for home insurance & maintenance.
- Can use Candler amenities
- Can use all OTOW Central amenities because "Gateway of Services" is a mandatory part of HOA fee.
- Cannot use Indigo or Weybourne Landing amenities

# Weybourne Landing

- Fee simple.
- Responsible for home insurance and maintenance.
- Can use Weybourne Landing amenities
- Can use OTOW Central amenities with purchase of "Gateway of Services" pass for \$900/home/year.
- Cannot use Candler or Indigo amenities.

## Why not "Spread the cost" of Candler Amenities Over Both Candler and OTOW Central?

- Candler amenities "right-sized" for 1600 homes.
- OTOW Central amenities "right-sized" for 8000 homes.
- Spreading operating costs of Candler amenities over OTOW Central as well as Candler Hills would reduce HOA fees in Candler and increase HOA fees in OTOW Central by about \$40/month.

# **OTOW** makes every effort to keep elevators running and has its own trained technicians

#### Elevators

As a means to help prevent elevator service stoppages, Parkway's elevator division has been a state-certified provider of maintenance services to the On Top of the World-Clearwater community since 2015.

Since its inception, Parkway has employed licensed mechanics with more than 60 years of technical experience in the vertical conveyance field. These technicians perform ongoing preventative maintenance, respond to service calls and handle complete operating equipment upgrades annually as scheduled.

Because the Management Company directly employs state-licensed elevator service technicians for both preventative maintenance, trouble shooting and expedited repairs, this ensures that when interruptions do occur, the response time, and more often than not, the repair time, is by far more expedient.

Additionally, all 83 elevators receive their preventative maintenance monthly, equating to 12 times yearly for each one!



it is nearly impossible to plan for every contingency.

Two of the most frequent causes of service calls lately is related to items falling into and blocking the elevator door tracks, or when the elevator times-out as a result. A timeout occurs when a door is blocked open for a short period and the safety shut-off shuts down the elevator until the service technician manually resets it.

#### Did You Know Concerns vs. Service Requests

Often times it can be difficult to distinguish between a concern and a service request.

Equally as difficult is deciding when to put something in writing, call the service line, or visit the Community Service Office (CSO).

When trying to decide, a good rule of thumb is to identify:

Is your concern about a possible rule violation within the community?

Will it require action from management company service personnel?

Will it require additional information or some action on your part?

Or, will it require an in-person visit?

Once you have established your question, you may decide on the appropriate course of action that is required based upon your specific circumstances.

Being prepared before you visit the CSO will ensure that your visit is streamlined and speedy.



• For a life-threatening emergency, please dial 911.



# Why does Candler Hills have 2 community centers with pools?

## 2006 Candler Hills "Hooks"

- Homeowners would own the land on which their home was built.
- Non-centralized mail, trash and recycling.
- There would be amenities exclusively for the use of residents of Candler Hills.

## <sup>2</sup>Candler Community Center was built as a "placeholder."

- Developer agreed to construct facility at appropriate size for 1600 homes when Candler Hills reached 600 homes.
- Developer paid 100% of the construction costs of The Lodge which opened in March of 2017.
- Candler Hills HOA responsible for operating costs. (50% first year, 100% thereafter.)
- Candler Hills HOA fee increased by \$20/month the first year and another \$20/month thereafter to cover Lodge operating costs.

## <sup>23</sup>Candler Hills Neighborhood Association, inc.

- Board members are all OTOW management
  - Ken Colen, Jo Layman, Bo Stepp
- No resident representation until 95% of "build out."
- Almost there until Ashford/Balfour added.
- Self-management will require purchasing amenities from OTOW.

# Golf Cart



- Insurance
  - Rider on Homeowner's policy. (Not valid outside OTOW gates.)
  - Separate policy (\$60-\$75/year). (OK outside gates, not valid where golf carts not allowed.)
- Registration
  - All household members present
  - Proof of 100/300 insurance (policy, not card)
  - Inspection (lights, horn, signals, brake lights)
- Handicapped sticker (no good outside the gates).

# Golf Cart Rules

- Golf cart vs Low-speed vehicle (LSV)
  - Golf cart (less than 20 mph)
    - Florida requires no license plate, registration with DMV or insurance. (OTOW req. insurance)
  - LSV (20 mph+)
    - Florida license plate, VIN, title and insurance required.
  - If you "soup up" your cart to LSV, be aware of the insurance risk!

# Who can drive a golf cart in OTOW?

- At least 15 years of age.
- Eligible for a Florida driver's license.
- Real cars with real dangers. Don't turn your golf cart over to those with no real driving experience.

# Where to drive your golf cart

## "Main drag"

Candler gate to the "4way stop." Use the "multi-modal path," not the street. (Path is 2-way.)



## Main Drag

4-way stop to the main gate. Use the multi-modal lane.(One-way on both sides of the street.



## SW 81st Loop

"Ring road" around Candler East. Path is for walking only. Golf carts use the street.



## SW 87th Circle

"Ring road" around Candler West. Use the multi-modal path where possible.











### • DMV

- Jasmine Plaza (can register to vote too).
- REAL ID compliant
  - Valid passport or certified birth certificate
  - Marriage license (to prove name change)
  - Proof of Social Security number
  - Proof of residence
- Turn in old title, show proof of insurance, fee \$400-\$500, get Florida title & plate.
- SunPass (<u>sunpass.com</u>)



# More Living in Florida

- Real Estate Taxes
  - New homes usually assessed at 80%.
  - Homestead exemption
    - You are legally a Florida resident living in your Florida home as your permanent residence on Jan. 1
    - Apply at county appraiser's office (or online) Jan. 2-March 1.
    - \$50,000 reduction in assessed value (\$25,000 for school).
    - Only need to apply once.
  - One tax bill in November with "discounts" if paid before March.

### **TRIM Notice**

### Your TRIM notice: explained

### **Parcel Identification** Number (PIN)

Taxing Authorities local government agencies that have the power to levy taxes.

**Your Property Taxes** Last Year- The prior year taxable value, less any millage rate, and tax amount.

Your taxes this year if No Budget Change is Made - This illustrates what your taxes would be if no proposed budget changes happen.





### Florida: Other Taxes

- NO personal income tax!
  - Pension and/or Social Security NOT taxed.
- Sales taxes pay for many things, so thank a tourist!
- Intangibles tax on investments repealed.
- No "personal property" tax(value of car, furnishings, etc.).

### Florida Hazards

- Sinkholes
  - Sandpile on top of limestone caverns
  - Acid rain weakens section of cavern roof
  - Roof collapse => sinkhole
  - Masonry/stucco houses & scam artists

## Sinkholes (cont.)

- Conventional sinkhole insurance
  - Hard to get if any activity nearby (within a mile)
  - 10% deductible
- Catastrophic Ground Cover Collapse
  - Included in ALL Florida homeowner policies
  - Same deductible as all other hazards
  - Trigger: foundation or bearing wall damage.
- What OTOW does to avoid sinkholes.

Hurricane Michael (October, 2018)

### Hurricanes

- Hurricane season: June 1 November 30
  - Peaks August September
- "Hurricanes don't come to Ocala." (5.2% chance of hurricane-force winds, increases to 5.8% by 2050.)
  - Tropical storm 39-74 mph, hurricane 75 mph & up
  - Wind force increases exponentially with speed!
  - Irma (2017) predicted 90 mph sustained winds for at least 2 hours.
  - Actually had gusts reaching 60 mph.





• Your home is strong! Marion County building code requires withstanding 130-140 mph gusts!

OTOW homes are built to withstand category 3 hurricanes.

## Hurricane Hazards


- Storm surge
  - Unlikely in Ocala, we're 125-feet above sea level.
- Heavy rain
  - No nearby rivers to flood.
  - Candler Hills is built on sand so it drains easily.
  - Excessive rain could cause sinkholes, but we had 15 inches over 2-3 days several years ago with no problems.

# Storms in OTOW

- Candler utilities are underground, but are fed by above-ground lines.
- Your water should flow and toilets flush.
- Duke Energy is responsible for power restoration, not OTOW!
- Your home is strong, but not if something flies through a window! Protect everyone by bringing loose stuff indoors or tying it down!
- OTOW will provide charging stations for phones and WiFi (customer service parking lot).
- If you have special needs, register so that special needs shelters are aware that you may be coming. (<u>alertmarion.com</u>)

- 2013 No power loss.

- 2016 3 hour power loss (hurricane Matthew, cat. 5)
- 2017 36 hour power loss (Irma, cat. 5) Stonebridge 72 hours
- 2018 No power loss.
- 2019 2022 No power loss.

### Whole-House Generator



- Usually 20 Kw and up.
- Require OTOW mod. + Marion County permit.
- \$6k-\$10k, plus \$2k to install
  - Concrete pad, gas line, electrical work.

### Portable Generator

- 1800-7500 watts.
- Approximately \$500.
- Gasoline or "Dual Fuel."



- Run 10-12 hours on 20-lb propane cylinder.
- Propane safer to store & will not degrade w/time.

### **Power-loss Problems**

- Refrigerator/freezer. Food loss begins after about 24 hours.
  - 1800-watt generator run 1 hour in morning and evening sufficient to keep food cold.
- Loss of A/C.
  - Run a fan unless your generator is whole-house.

# Loss of power problems

- Lighting
  - Newer OTOW houses have low-power bulbs (e.g. LED)
  - Reading lamp draws only 10-15 watts
- Medical Equipment
  - e.g. CPAP (10-watts)



 Will you run a 4Kw (noisy) generator all night (& disturb neighbors) to power a 10-watt CPAP?

# **Basic Hurricane Prep.**

- Weather radio (battery backup)! (Tornados form in "feeder bands" far away from the eye of the storm and in places the storm is not headed.) <u>weatherradios.com</u> - SAME codes (Marion 012083)
- OTOW water will probably flow, but a case of bottled water wouldn't hurt.
- Just in case, fill tub with water for flushing.
- Fuel for your generator and a full tank in car.
- Cash. ATM's and credit card systems may be down for several days.
- Canned or shelf-stable food for several days.


- Most can be used without electrical power, but the burner igniters won't fire. Will need matches or lighter.




